Career Opportunity for a Specialty Transport Manager in Colorado Springs, CO.

The **Specialty Care Team (SCT) Manager** oversees the High Risk Obstetrical (HROB) , Neonatal and Pediatric specialty care teams. Supervises the SCT Lead Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT) and SCT Lead RNs.

- Accountable for excellence in leadership, clinical practice and operational management. Ensures quality, safe service delivery surrounding and during interfacility patient care transport by fixed-wing, ground ambulance or helicopter.
- Makes operational management and clinical performance decisions for MST in compliance with regulations.
- Directs the development of policies, procedures, guidelines, and protocols.
- Directs development of the education, safety and quality programs.
- Ensures all staff are qualified and competent through the Team Leads. Selects, coaches, and administers corrective action and performance appraisals to team leads and their team members.
- Coordinates with interdisciplinary healthcare team leaders to include the MST Medical Directors and leadership of the vehicle vendor partners.
- Accountable for budget, appropriate utilization of resources and productivity.

Job Duties:

- Maintains competency to provide the care and services as it applies to the department's patient/customer population and as defined in the department's Scope of Service document. Quality, Safety and Regulatory Compliance Directs the Quality Management Program, approves policies and procedures.
- Orients and advises the SCT Leads through the monthly and quarterly transport audit and case review process per established guidelines.
- Develops and maintains improvements to the Quality Improvement Program through the review and monitor of performance improvement indicators and outcome data.
- Monitors and trends safety of MST and the quality of patient care.
- Educates and supports Team Leads and Medical Directors to comply with the National Patient Safety Goals, and all regulatory standards with agencies such as the Commission for Air Medical Transport Systems (CAMTS), FAA, the Joint Commission and vehicle vendor partners.
- Oversees monitoring for staff completion of required safety training per regulatory agencies. Ensure all staff can identify and report hazards to management and safety committees.

Requirements:

- Bachelor's degree in a relevant field.
- 3 years critical care clinical experience and 3 years of management experience in critical care transport.
- Registered Respiratory Therapist or Registered Nurse.
- BLS for an RN or a RT through the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross CPR for the Professional Rescuer with card in-hand before start date. BLS or CPR card must be good through sixty days of hire. All life support certification cards must be issued by either the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross CPR for the Professional Rescuer. (American Red Cross for the Professional Rescuer is only good upon hire and all renewals will need to be through an American Heart Association sanctioned course.)
- R.T. Requirements: NRP within six months. CNPT or ACCS within one year. CMTE within one year
- RN requirements: NRP within 6 months of hire. Any of the following within 6 months of hire: CEN, CFRN, CTRN, RNC. CMTE within one year
